What can schools do?

- · Encourage people into the profession.
- Work with providers to offer placements.
- Work with providers to support Intensive Training and Practice.

What does a placement involve?

- Teaching experience in a classroom
- Support from a trained mentor, including weekly mentor meetings.
- Opportunities to shadow and learn from experienced teachers.
- · Feedback, advice and reflection.
- A nurturing environment in which to learn, grow and develop their own teaching style.

Have you got great class teachers, who can:

- Articulate what they are doing and why?
- Let go of their class to allow a trainee to take increasing responsibility?
- Clearly model up-to-date subject and phase pedagogy?
- Engage in their own professional development and demonstrate lifelong learning?

Have you got great mentors, who can:

- Undertake required training to become a mentor?
- Support and challenge trainees as they progress?
- Commit to weekly mentoring time?
- Clearly model up-to-date subject and phase pedagogy?
- Engage in their own professional development and demonstrate lifelong learning?





Other ways of engaging with ITT:

- Leadership support governance, trainee recruitment interviews.
- Subject/Phase expertise.
- Contribute to a taught course.
- Whole school approaches and expertise.
- Engaging with providers to support Intensive Training and Practice.
